

Groyne upgrade - Dundee Beach boat ramp

Dear Stakeholder

The Northern Territory Government is upgrading the groyne at the Dundee Beach boat ramp to reduce the build-up of sand on the ramp and the frequency of maintenance requirements.

Works will include installation of a walkway jetty, improved access to the groyne, a concrete pathway and fishing platform along the top of the groyne. The walkway and platform will allow for land-based fishing and the new jetty will accommodate short-term mooring of vessels to facilitate loading and unloading without impacting ramp use.

A design and construct tender was released in late June, with an anticipated contract award date in September 2022.

Engineering design and documentation of the new groyne and jetty is expected to take approximately five months to complete and will include complex modelling to inform the groyne design.

Works on site are anticipated to commence in quarter two, 2023.

Boat ramp users can expect some disruption at times during the works and ramp tidal accessibility will remain at 2.8 metres.

The department will issue updated information as the project progresses and milestones are reached.
