

TIGER BRENNAN DRIVE AND BERRIMAH ROAD OVERPASS

The Department of Infrastructure, Planning and Logistics is constructing an overpass at the Tiger Brennan Drive and Berrimah Road intersection.

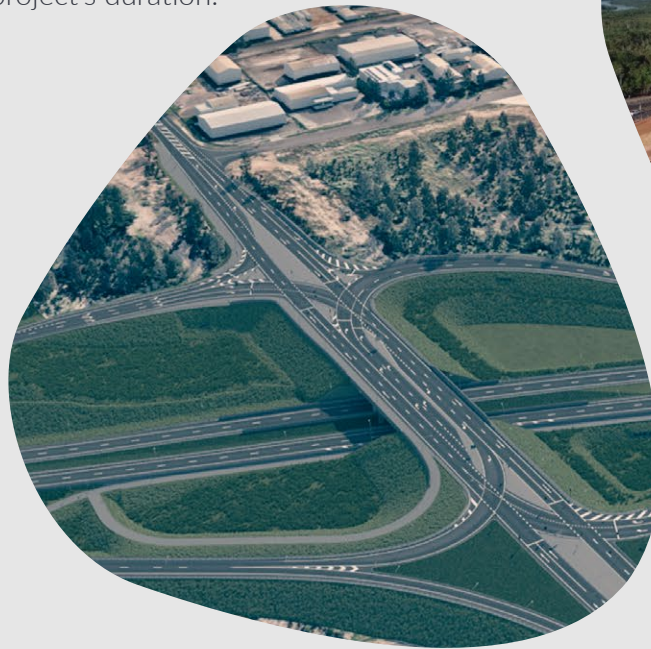
The project is jointly funded by the Australian and Northern Territory governments.

The new overpass will carry Berrimah Road traffic over Tiger Brennan Drive, separating the major flow of traffic on Tiger Brennan Drive from the traffic movements on Berrimah Road enabling the continuous flow of traffic and improved safety.

Construction of the Tiger Brennan Drive and Berrimah Road overpass is being rolled out in phases.

The next phase of the project is due to start on 19 November 2023, subject to weather.

Due to the scale of the project, detours and road closures will be in place for the majority of the project's duration.

Road closure and detours

In order to progress with construction of the approach for the new bridge, Berrimah Road south of the existing intersection down to Wishart Road will be closed to all road users.

Road users have an alternative route to access East Arm via Wishart Road.

Tiger Brennan Drive will remain open and vehicles travelling between Darwin and Palmerston can continue to travel along Tiger Brennan Drive as normal. Berrimah Road north from Tiger Brennan Drive to Marlow Road will initially remain closed until it is reopened around the end of March 2024, subject to the impacts of the wet season.

This phase includes the demolition of existing road infrastructure and construction of fill embankments, installation of major culverts, a signalised intersection, pavements and street lighting.

Traffic will be transitioned to the new alignment of Tiger Brennan Drive in stages once the bridge construction is substantially complete and safe to allow vehicles to pass underneath.

Consideration has been given to minimise impact for heavy and emergency vehicles as well as the general travelling public and local businesses.

It is expected this stage of the project will take between 10-12 months to complete.
