
NAMING OF PUBLIC PLACE

I, DELIA PHOEBE LAWRIE, the Minister for Planning and Lands:

- (a) under section 11 of the *Place Names Act* and with reference to section 43 of the *Interpretation Act*, revoke the instrument dated 26 October 2000 published in *Gazette* No. G44 of 8 November 2000 so far as it relates to approving the naming of and Nutwood Park; and,
- (b) under section 11 of the *Place Names Act*, approve the recommendation contained in a report by the Place Names Committee that the roads and park shown hatched on the plan appearing in the schedule be named Bauldry Avenue, Savage Close, Catt Crescent, Bowrey Avenue, Scott Court, Kyabra Street, and Phyllis Uren Park respectively, as indicated on the plan in the Schedule.

NOTE:

BAULDRY AVENUE	is named in commemoration of Mary Ann Farrar (nee Bauldry) (1849-1917), who married John Samuel Farrar at Bourke, NSW, in 1873.
SAVAGE CLOSE	is named in commemoration of Joseph Hugh Savage, Teamster and drover in the VRD in the late 1920s and early 1930s.
CATT CRESCENT	is named after "Mount Catt", north of Roper River and one of the early stations held by the Farrar family in the 1920s.
BOWREY CRESCENT	is named in commemoration of Ronald (Roley) Douglas Bowrey (b1907); Stockman; a member of 1932 Schultz Expedition travelling in convoy from Queensland to Tanami goldfields via Wave Hill station.
SCOTT COURT	is named in commemoration of brothers William Sydney (Syd) Scott and George Edward (Frank) Scott born Braidwood NSW; overlanded cattle from Goulburn NSW area to Willeroo Station NT in 1882; early supporters of the Katherine River Turf Club.
KYABRA STREET	is named after the Queensland Station established by John Costello in 1868 and where J S Farrar worked for Costello before

becoming his manager on the “Diamentina River”, Qld, and “Lake Nash”, NT, stations.

PHYLLIS UREN PARK

is named in commemoration of Phyllis Uren (nee Farrar) (1920-2003) the great-granddaughter of Samuel and Mary Ann Farrar after whom the suburb is named.
